NEWCOMERS BOOK CLUB

About 10 of us met for dinner at LR before attending the talk by Isabel Wilkerson on Feb. 20 at LRU. Several who attended had not read her book "The Warmth of Other Suns", but still found her to be an engaging speaker and her talk very informative.

Our next meeting will be March 26th at 1:30 at the Women's Resource Center at which time we will discuss the nonfiction book "The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks" by Rebecca Skloot. The book chronicles her life and how scientists who know her as HeLa used her cells. She was a poor Southern tobacco farmer who worked the same land as her slave ancestors, yet her cells-taken without her knowledge-became one of the most important tools in medicine. The first "immortal" human cells grown in culture, they are still alive today, though she has been dead for more than sixty years. If you could pile all HeLa cells ever grown onto a scale, they'd weigh more than 50 million metric tons-as much as a hundred Empire State Buildings. HeLa cells were vital for developing the polio vaccine; uncovered secrets of cancer, viruses, and the atom bomb's effects; helped lead to important advances like in vitro fertilization, cloning, and gene mapping; and have been bought and sold by the billions.
