Notes from our President



Our second quarter charity is the **Robin's Nest Children's Advocacy Center** in Caldwell County. This center "serves the needs of sexually and severely physically abused children."

From Tana Murray, Robins Nest Interim Director:

"The lives of children are fragile. They depend on the adults in their lives to protect them and keep them safe. That is the ideal. However, there are children that live in fear. Things are done to them by trusted adults that they - the children - don't understand. Robin's Nest exists to help children to work through their fear and to put the "bad stuff" behind them. It is wonderful to see a child that came into Robin's Nest with her head down and not speaking begin to show signs of returning to a happy child. She was kept in a dog house; she escaped with her dog and was found wandering down a dirt road. When ask what she was doing out that late at night, she stated that she was looking for food. She is now with a family where she is safe and protected. Our Trauma Therapist is working with her to replace the "bad stuff" with "good stuff."

Their most current needs include **Juice Boxes**, individually packaged **Peanut Butter & Crackers**, **Cheese & Crackers** and **Cookies**. Of course checks and cash are always needed! Thank you for your generosity. Bev Forrest
