General Meeting and Program

January 11th, Meeting - The meeting starts at 10:30 a.m. at Hickory Regional Airport, 3101 9th Ave. Dr. NW.

Program "Spending Hickory Bond Money"

You will have a chance to learn details about Hickory's plan to connect its lakefront parks with a paved greenway at our Jan. 11 monthly meeting. Brian Frazier, the city's planning director, will show sketches and details of the construction plans for the Riverwalk, which will begin in Geitner Park and follow the river beneath the future U.S. 321 bridges. He will also talk about Citywalk, a broad pedestrian and bicycle connector that will be built along Main Avenue, linking Lenoir-Rhyne University and downtown. Both will be funded with proceeds from a \$25 million bond issue approved by Hickory voters. Another \$15 million in bonds will be used for economic development, including development of an industrial park on Startown Road. The presentation begins at 10:30 a.m. at Hickory Regional Airport, just past the Crawdads stadium. We meet in the old terminal building, near Hickory Hop and Crosswind Cafe.
