#### Speaker to talk about -Shingles-

The Centers for Disease control says one out of every three people will develop Shingles in their lifetime.

We have two speakers on **Wednesday, Jan. 10**, will tell us about a new vaccine that CDS says is far better than Zostavax, the vaccine that most of us have had. Two representatives from the Catawba County Health Department will tell us about Shangri, which reduces the risk of shingles by more than 50 percent. Even if you have already had Zostavax, you should have the new vaccine, which is recommended for all healthy people 50 years and older.
