
Due to Scheduling conflicts with the Holiday, there will be no Dominoes game in September.

On The Road

Hart Square, Saturday, October 27, 2018 Here we go again – and you're invited!

Hart Square is the world's largest collection of wood buildings from the 1840s. Dr Robert Hart, a retired physician has collected over 103 historic buildings displayed in South Catawba County near Vale. Fully



furnished buildings include homes, barns, churches, stores, a post office, a jail, a grist mill, a moonshine still, a two-story cotton gin building, a school and a working groundhog kiln. These are just a few examples. The buildings have over 200 live artisans, crafters, and docents in period dress demonstrating tinsmithing, gunsmithing, molasses cooking, cornshuck dolls, and numerous other items of interest. Each area is furnished in period style from the 1840s. Only open to the public on the fourth Saturday in October each year and reviewed as "much better than Williamsburg," this once-a-year celebration is an event not to be missed! Food, fun, learning, historic information, crafts and even the opportunity to be locked up in the jail is available.

Mike and Sandy Sigmon have the opportunity to pre-purchase tickets for the Saturday, October 27, 2018 Hart Square event which usually only go on sale on October 1st and all 5, 000 tickets *always* sell out in less than 90 minutes that day! Newcomers can purchase group tickets early at the same price without the hassle of waiting in line or on the phone. Tickets are \$45 each this year (due to the state requiring taxes to be collected) and the **absolute deadline** for Mike to have your check is **Wednesday**, **September 12th**. You must give Mike or Sandy your check before September 12th and if you don't catch them in person, please mail with a self-addressed stamped envelope to have your tickets and map mailed back to you.
