Tammy is currently working on a novel based on the life of her Great-Grandmother who was an orphan train rider in \$\frac{1}{2}860\$.


Tammy Wilson: Biography




Tammy Wilson spent most of her career writing and editing and for the past thirteen years, she has penned a column for local newspapers. She has also contributed to WFA Eats: All Things Food and Culture hosted by WFAE public radio in Charlotte, NC.

Wilson's graduate study of Southern literature morphed into presentations for the NC Humanities Council catalog: "Southern Selves: The Child as Storyteller" and "What Makes a Southern Story Southern?" as a Road Scholar for the North Carolina Humanities Council. A third program is "Sarah Mc Guirk: Orphan Train Rider," highlighting her lifelong interest in family stories and research.

Her creative work often explores themes of family conflict, belonging, and obsession with celebrity. Her work has appeared in such publications as Story South, North Carolina Literary Review and Our State. She is a graduate of the University of Missouri, School of Journalism and earned an MFA in creative writing from the University of Southern Maine. Wilson published a story collection Dining with Robert Redford, in 2011, and in 2018 she co-edited IDOL TALK: Women Writers on the Teenage Infatuations that Changed Their Lives, published by McFarland & Co.



Since retiring from the Catawba County Library System, Wilson has continued to write and give presentations. She is currently at work on a novel based on the life of her great-grandmother, Sarah McGuirk, who was an orphan train rider in 1860.
