For 2020, we have menu planners eager to craft a dining experience for the months of February, April, June, August, and October.



A shuttle leaves the center at 6:00 am taking g people to jobs.

This program actually started in January of this year, involves HSK working with employment agencies, like Manpower, to help people who need work, and also to help those who have a job, but need transportation, get matched up with volunteer drivers who drive them in a van purchased from Steve White Motors. 
