Details: Riverbend Park has many paths and Harlan and Amy Chizen would like to take you on a hike there. The trails are through the woods, with some hills, some flat areas, some wetter areas, and some grassy areas. Obviously, the trail conditions will be dependent on recent weather conditions. October Program and General Meeting

Wednesday October 9th at 10:30am at the Hickory Regional Airport



Hickory Mayor Hank Guess will update Newcomers on Wednesday, Oct. 9, about work that has begun on City Walk, part of the \$40 million bond projects approved by city voters. The meeting starts at 10:30 a.m. in the Hickory Regional Airport's terminal building. The city broke ground on the trail on Sept. 23 and has already completed the center portion, in downtown Hickory.

The 10-foot wide paved City Walk trail will run for 1.7 miles, from near the campus of Lenoir-Rhyne University, along Main Avenue, with a bridge across NC 127, through downtown and ending at 9th St. NW.

Other grants will allow the city and N.C. Department of Transportation to connect City Walk by way of Old Lenoir Road to the future Riverwalk, a stretch totaling 5.2 miles.

TABLE TALK

In the aftermath of a flood that washes away much of a small Tennessee town, evangelical preacher Asher Sharpe offers shelter to two gay men. In doing so, he starts to see his life anew, and risks losing everything: his wife, locked into her



religious prejudices; his congregation, which shuns Asher after he delivers a passionate sermon in defense of tolerance; and his young son, Justin caught in the middle of what turns into a bitter custody battle. With no way out but ahead, Asher takes Justin and flees to Key West where he hopes to find his brother, Luke, whom he'd turned against years ago after Luke came out. And it is there, at the southernmost point in the country, that Asher and Justin discover a new way of thinking about the world, and a new way of understanding love.




