





Within in 54 hours, a hospital of tents was erected near what is now the Hickory water treatment plant. That extraordinary effort involved doctors, nurses, volunteers, plumbers, carpenters and even prison workers.

In the year that the hospital operated, it treated 454 children from the region.

The speaker, representing the Catawba County History Museum, will talk with us at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, March 11, at the Hickory Regional Airport. We don't have a speaker's name to share with you yet, but please come hear about the Miracle of Hickory.

After lunch we will drive to the **Pisgah National Forrest** to see **Looking Glass Falls**, one of the most photographed waterfalls in the Country. There is a short walk to observation deck. There is a 200 foot walk from the gravel access road. We will walk up steps and go 25 yards up the trail. The falls are on the right. Wear good walking or hiking shoes.

Safe Harbor is a nonprofit, non-government funded Christ-centered community for rebuilding, renewing and recovery for women who have been abused and are in a TRANSITIONAL stage of their lives having completed programs regarding their addiction or offense. The programs provide evidence-based, faith-inspired resources for success.

Safe Harbor offers a three-prong approach to helping these women:

NEW DAY PROGRAMS: classes, groups and programs that are especially geared toward women and children of all walks of life. Programs include NOW (New Opportunities for Women Experiencing poverty); MINnows (Mothers and Infants Nurturing); Greenleaf Transitional Living (16 transitional apartments); On Purpose (Classes for women of all walks of life to learn their purpose in life); The Bridge (an Outreach to those in sex trafficking.)

THRIVE RECOVERY PROGRAMS: Many families and individuals in our community who find they are barely surviving due to substance use disorders. Programs include: Whole Women (residential for women); Thrive Recovery Community-Coed classes support groups and events.

RESOURCE WAREHOUSE AND GALLERY: Social Experience. A creative reuse center on Highway 70 that provides work skills training for program participants, while generating income and raising awareness for Safe Harbor.
