

**COVID-19 advisory:** Please be aware that almost all people who are bowling at Pin Station are NOT wearing masks. Many people wear masks when


entering and leaving Pin Station and when going to the snack bar or bathroom. But very few people are wearing masks at the lanes when they are bowling.
