## **PROGRAM NEWS**

Newcomers Tour - October 12, 2022 - 10:30 AM Guest Speaker — Kevin McCutcheon

Our next General meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 12, 2022, at 10:30 AM in the Hickory Airport meeting room.

Our program speaker will be Kevin McCutcheon, and he will present news about the Toys for Tots program and the Catawba Valley Marine Corp Detachment #1163. The Marine Corps League perpetuates the traditions and spirit of ALL Marines and Navy FMF Sailors, who proudly wear or who have worn the eagle, globe and anchor of the Corps. It takes great pride in crediting its founding in 1923 to World War I hero, then Major General Commandant John A. Lejeune. The League is the only Federally Chartered Marine Corps related veterans organization in the country. The League supports the Toys for Tots efforts working with the Marine Corps Reserve and Toys for Tots Foundation to raise millions of dollars for the youth of America, as well as collect and distribute millions of toys all across the United States.

The Marine Corps League also provides funeral honors support to over 10,000 funerals per year. This support allows the Marine Corps (Active and Reserve) to focus more of their resources on mission preparation. The Marine Corps League also supports the Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation, Semper Fi Fund, Navy Marine Corps Relief Society, Mack's Marines, and the Young Marines. They have several scholarship/award programs including the Marine Corps University Lt Gen Lejeune Leadership Award, Delta Dental Scholarship, and college scholarships through the Marine Corps League Foundation. And one of our most critical missions is assisting transitioning Marines and their families in support of the Marine Corps' Marine for Life program.







We have just finished our 3rd Quarter Charity (Good Samaritan Food Pantry), but I would like to do one bonus collection for them at our next general meeting. When I delivered this last donation the director told me that 2nd Harvest had just informed them that they will be cutting back on the food they give them. # On to our 4th Quarter Charity - the Marine Toys for Tots Here's a little information about them:

The mission of the Marine Toys for Tots Foundation is to assist the U. S. Marine Corps in providing a tangible sign of hope to economically disadvantaged children at Christmas. This assistance includes providing day-to-day leadership and oversight of the Program, raising funds to provide toys to supplement the collections of local Toys for Tots Campaigns, to provide promotional and support material and defray the costs of conducting annual Toys for Tots Campaigns. Local campaigns are generally organized and coordinated by the Marine Corps League Detachments. GOAL: The primary goal of Marine Toys for Tots is, through the gift of a new toy, help bring the joy of Christmas and send a message of hope to America's less fortunate children. #### Halloween Jalapeño Poppers

- ♦ 10 Jalapeno peppers, sliced in half lengthwise and pith/seeds removed. Leave the stem on the pepper.
- ♦ 8 oz Cream Cheese, room temperature
- ♦ 8 oz Jack Cheese, shredded
- 1 Scallion (green onion) finely chopped
- ♦ 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 Package refrigerated Pillsbury crescent rolls
- ♦ 2 eggs
- ♦ Candy eyeballs
- 1. Preheat oven  $400^{\circ}$  F. In a small bowl, mix the cream cheese, jack cheese, scallion and salt until well blended.
- 2. Roll out the crescent rolls and separate into 4 rectangles (not triangles) with a perforation in the middle of each. Press your fingers into the perforations to seal them. Using a pizza cutter, cut each rectangle into 10 long pieces lengthwise.
- 3. Fill each jalapeño half with the cheese mixture. Wrap each jalapeño half with the dough, leaving a space for the eyes. Use two pieces of dough if necessary. Brush with egg mixture and place on baking sheet.
- 4. Bake in oven for 8-10 minutes. Remove from the oven and press the eyes into the cheese where the opening is. Serve immediately.

# Sponsorship Corner

The Western Piedmont Sister Cities Association (WPSCA) (www.westernpiedmontsistercities.org) was officially formed in 1993 and in 1997 made international history by connecting four counties located in the Western North Carolina region (Alexander, Burke, Caldwell and Catawba) with Altenburger Land, a region located in the former East German Federal State of Thuringia. This created the first region-to-region partnership for Sister Cities International (www.sister-cities.org), which is a global leader in citizen diplomacy. Sister Cities programs promote peace and understanding through joint exchanges that focus on arts and culture, youth and education, business and trade, and community development, all of which are essential in developing, growing, and maintaining people-to-people relationships around the world. Local governments in the 4-county region pay annual membership dues and may contribute additional funding throughout the year, which is combined with corporate and scholarship foundation monies for specific activities, events, and exchanges. Each local government member appoints two representatives to serve on the WPSCA Board. Administrative support services are generously provided by the Western Piedmont Council of Governments (WPCOG). WPSCA local meetings are held the 4 th Wednesday of every other month at 4pm at a different location within our 4county region. On the alternate month, WPSCA meets virtually via WebEx with their partners in Altenburger Land. For each virtual meeting, there is a themed topic selected in advance and leaders and colleagues engaged in this topic are invited to attend on both sides to discuss future projects and exchanges together. Since 2020, there have been joint virtual meetings to discuss education/ school to school pairing, arts/music/film, sports tourism, emergency management/first responders (police, fire, EMS), civic organizations, and governments and municipalities, and there is one final meeting scheduled in November to discuss economic development and business. In 2023, we are looking to discuss youth leadership/ young entrepreneurs, historical associations, health and wellness, and we are going to circle back around to education & amp; schools/school pairings and exchanges, which was temporarily suspended during COVID. In 2023 WPSCA will also be celebrating its 30th Anniversary in partnership with Altenburger Land. We hope to welcome a delegation from Altenburger Land to our region so we can celebrate together.

'ncvmembers@googlegroups.com.' The method for utilizing this address is to use the "bcc" option in the "to" portion of your email program. In essence, this sends an individual email to each member. The problem comes in responding to these emails and each email program has its own built in settings.

When I reply to an email that has a "via novmembers" address, I always make sure that the reply is going to the person who sent it (for example me with my weekly Activities column). If you look at the "to" portion of your return email, you should see only the person's name to whom you are responding. If you see something else, it will — most likely — go to EVERYONE in the club. Sometimes you really don't want that. And most members already have enough emails to delete on a daily basis.

So, please be mindful of reply emails to those sent to the entire club. Every members' email is listed in the printable directory and/or in the 'list all members' portion of the website. Hope this will help with unneeded emails in the future.




