A In Loving Memory



Harlan J. Chizen passed away on the morning of December 12, 2022, after a brief struggle with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease. He was diagnosed at the end of August 2022, and he deteriorated rapidly. He died peacefully at home, just as he had wished. Harlan was born in Manhattan, NY, March 22, 1951. He was the first-born to Sidney and Mildred Chizen, followed 3 years later by a sister, Lorelle. He resided in the Bay Parkway area of Brooklyn, NY, until heading off to MIT at the age of 16. After receiving his Bachelor's Degree in Electrical Engineering (because there was no Computer Science degree back then) in

1971, he continued his education at Boston College with an MBA in Accounting. He worked in the Computer, Accounting and Finance areas of manufacturing companies for his entire career. He retired from Chase Corporation, headquartered in Massachusetts, April 3, 2020. After his retirement, he held one job, that of Census Taker during the summer of 2020.

Harlan met Amy (Conroy) while living and working in Chicago, IL. This meeting took place at a square dance in Wilmette, IL, on October 24, 1980. They were dance partners, and partners in life thereafter; their wedding took place one year later, October 24, 1981. Having been transferred with his job back to Massachusetts, they resided there for 8 years. During these years they continued to square dance and took up round dancing as well (round dancing is similar to ballroom dancing). A job change brought a move to Connecticut, which was their home for almost 30 years. In 1991 a son, Adam, was born. He and his son, Sterling, currently reside outside of Seattle, WA. As Harlan's retirement was nearing, the decision was made to relocate to Hickory, NC, which took place in 2018.

Travelling was something Harlan always looked forward to, even though he didn't get to do it as much as he wished. There were trips to England, Italy, Ireland, Greece, Spain, Aruba, a river cruise on the Danube, and a cruise to Alaska. His dream vacation destination was Egypt, so he took great interest in the pharaohs and pyramids. Alas, that trip didn't happen, between the closures from COVID and then ALS. Closer to home, trips took place around visits to family and friends: Texas, Washington, California and Arizona. He was enjoying getting to know his new state of residence.

His personal interests included classical music, opera and art. He always said he had no talent in these areas himself, so he loved to be involved through those who had the talent. He had begun to study and experiment with photography in the last few years. He was well-known in the neighborhood for his daily walks, which were generally around 5 miles long. These walks could be in the immediate neighborhood, or out in the woods at Hilton Park, Geitner Park or, his favorite, River Bend Park.

Harlan was predeceased by his father, mother and sister. He will be greatly missed by his wife and son, but is remembered fondly for his intelligence, dry humor, and attention to detail. His down-to-earth logic kept everyone grounded and on task. Amy would also like to express her deepest appreciation for all the cards, love and support that poured out from the NCV members. It made the whole situation bearable, beginning to end, and even beyond.

Greetings and Happy New Year! We have 2 opportunities to support those less fortunate this month.

The first is through our 1st Quarter charity – Our Nest Diaper Pantry. Here's some information about the organization: Our Nest was established in September of 2021 with a grant and community diaper drive. No other social programs assist parents in providing diapers for their children during a crisis or emergency. The pandemic exacerbated the current need for a community diaper bank. The pantry was established to end diaper need in our community and allow for young children to grow and thrive in a clean and healthy environment while also communicating other helpful programs to parents with young children. Parents can receive a packet of 20 diapers, wipes (when available), parenting information, and access to a family support specialist to assist with community referrals up to twice per month at The Children's Resource Center at 738 4th St SW Hickory, NC 28602. They are open Monday- Friday from 8a.m.-5pm. Parents can call ahead to have the diapers ready for pick up, the number to Our Nest is 828-695-6517. The parent is asked to fill out a 5 questions survey, but do not have to complete it to receive a supplemental supply of diapers. The survey allows Our Nest to get a snapshot of diaper need in the community and help them plan for the sustainability of the diaper pantry. Participants are asked to be from Catawba County, but no proof of residence or ID is required.

The Children's Resource Center itself strives to be an information clearinghouse on child and family resources. They provide not only parent referrals and support, but also information on what programs is available in the community and how to access those resources. They work closely with agencies and child/family programs in a collaborative effort to reach the Smart Start goal of every Catawba County

child being healthy and ready to learn upon entry into kindergarten. They can assist parents with finding an agency that can help with a specific need. WEBSITE https://childrensresourcecenter.org/ or https://catawbakids.com/




