

The book for our March discussion is Lessons in Chemistry by Bonnie Garmus: NEW YORK TIMES BESTSELLER • GOOD MORNING AMERICA BOOK CLUB PICK A must-read debut! Meet Elizabeth Zott: a "formidable, unapologetic and inspiring" (PARADE) scientist in 1960s California whose career takes a detour when she becomes the unlikely star of a beloved TV cooking show in this novel that is "irresistible, satisfying, and full of fuel. It reminds you that change takes time and always requires heat" (The New York Times Book Review). "A unique heroine ... you'll find yourself wishing she wasn't fictional." —Seattle Times Chemist *Elizabeth Zott is*

not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel-prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo. Laugh-out-loud funny, shrewdly observant, and studded with a dazzling cast of supporting characters, Lessons in Chemistry is as original and vibrant as its protagonist. Our Nest Diaper Pantry is our quarterly charity. It was established in September 2021 with a grant and a community diaper drive it is part of the children's' resource center. The pandemic exacerbated the current need for a community diaper bank. The pantry was established to end diaper need in our community and allow for young children to grow and thrive in a clean and healthy environment while also communicating other helpful programs to parents with young children. Parents can receive a packet of 20 diapers, wipes (when available), parenting information, and access to a family support specialist to assist with community referrals up to twice per month at The Children's Resource Center at 738 4th St SW Hickory, NC 28602. They are open Monday- Friday from 8a.m.-5p.m. Parents can call ahead to have the diapers ready for pick up, the number to Our Nest is 828-695-6517. The Children's Resource Center itself strives to be an information clearinghouse on child and family resources. They provide not only parent referrals and support, but also information on what programs are available in the community and how to access those resources. They work closely with agencies and child/family programs in a collaborative effort to reach the Smart Start goal of every Catawba County child being healthy and ready to learn upon entry into kindergarten. 
