The next meeting of the Book Club will be held on Wednesday, May 24th, 2023 at 1:30 P.M. The book for our May discussion will be Diamond Eye by Kate Quinn, New York Times Bestseller. The bestselling author of The Rose Code returns with an unforgettable World War II tale of a quiet bookworm who becomes history's deadliest female sniper. Based on a true story. In 1937 in the snowbound city of Kyiv, wry and bookish history student Mila Pavlichenko organizes her life around her library job and her young son—but Hitler's invasion of Ukraine and Russia sends her on a different path. Given a rifle and sent to join the fight, Mila must forge herself from studious girl to deadly sniper—a lethal hunter of Nazis known as Lady Death. When news of her three hundredth kill makes her a national heroine, Mila finds herself torn from the bloody battlefields of the eastern front and sent to America on a goodwill tour. Still reeling from war wounds and devastated by loss, Mila finds herself isolated and lonely in the glittering world of Washington, DC—until an unexpected friendship with First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt and an even more unexpected connection with a silent fellow sniper offer the possibility of happiness. But when an old enemy from Mila's past joins forces with a deadly new foe lurking in the shadows, Lady Death finds herself battling her own demons and enemy bullets in the deadliest duel of her life. Based on a true story, The Diamond Eye is a haunting novel of heroism born of desperation, of a mother who became a soldier, of a woman who found her place in the world and changed the course of history forever. April 1 begins our 2nd quarter charity, but before I tell you about that I want to thank all of you who donated diapers and wipes and creams to Our Nest Diaper Pantry. As usual you went over and above!

We'll be helping older children this next quarter at Southmountain. Their CEO, Chris Jernigan, will be our program at the April 12th meeting. At the meeting we will be collecting twin sheets, pillows, comforters for twin beds, dish towels, wash cloths and toilette paper for the houses. We'll try to fill Chris's car!



Here's a little information about the ministry: Starting in 1903, Southmountain's primary function was to educate and teach industrial skills to children in rural Rutherford County. The mission was transformed into housing and caregiving for abandoned children during the Great Depression, and in 1935 the organization relocated to Nebo in Burke County. More recently, the group-care model was retired in favor of the neighborhood-style care that they now provide to foster children in eight homes, bound by a circular driveway right around the corner from their original Nebo headquarters.

The 150-acre neighborhood provides "professional" parents whose care and stability allow the best possible environment for the children in their care. This model allows them to marry the best part of group care with the best part of traditional foster care; it improves foster children's quality of life and the best part is that it allows siblings to stay together. The campus also features state-of-the-art facilities and recreation opportunities, from hiking trails to a playground to an indoor pool.

In addition to the foster care community in Nebo, the organization operates the Burke County Children's Advocacy Center in downtown Morganton and ten additional advocacy centers across North Carolina, stretching from Brevard to Morehead City. When children and families face the pain and trauma of child abuse, a child advocacy center provides consolidated care and a source of comfort, information, and, best of all - a solution. Advocacy centers bring law enforcement, medical care, therapy, and social services together under one roof. This efficiency spares children continued trauma and allows healing to begin sooner. Southmountain has become a leader in implementing this model and the services it provides, including Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, the gold standard of care for child victims of abuse. Ensuring safe, convenient (a significant obstacle for some families) care to child victims of abuse is a priority of Southmountain; therefore, in 2022, they created a full-time Spanish language program for non-English speaking victims and their families.

They continue to innovate and find ways to improve care and provide their services. One of the most important ways they do this is by educating our communities that their facilities exist, and it's most effective when described through outreach like this!




